



Leisure Lake is a senior citizen community of 211 homes, located at 20th Street West and Avenue E in the unincorporated area of the Antelope Valley.

We strongly oppose the increased importation and the current practice of importing trash to the Lancaster Landfill.


We do support extending the life of the landfill, and restricting its use to the trash collected in the Antelope Valley Region.

We believe that the increase in truck traffic will lead to an increase in air pollution due to the exhaust, dust and loose trash. Additional truck traffic would add to the congestion on the Antelope Valley Freeway (SR-14) and increase the traffic hazards on our local roads at the time of day our residents travel.


We also oppose the mitigation plan to extend Ave. F easterly across Sierra Hwy and the railroad tracts and bringing the truck traffic to exit the freeway at Ave. F and accessing the landfill. This plan would bring the noise of the trucks and the air pollution and the congestion to our neighborhood. Ave. F is our access to the freeway, the trucks would create an additional hazard for our residents. The intersection of 20th St. W. and Ave. F is narrow and the visibility is poor. An at grade crossing of Ave. F would create an additional hazard. We believe that Ave. H is the proper access route to the landfill as Ave. H is multilaned has traffic signals at the freeway ramps, and an overpass of Sierra Hwy. and the railroad.

We strongly urge a "NO" to the increase and importation of trash to the Antelope Valley.





3. The number of trucks involved will certainly cause more pollution. What is the plan to overcome that situation?

4. They estimate that in sixteen to eighteen years the Landfill will be full. We have not seen written plans on what is going to happen to trash from the Antelope Valley when this is full and there is nowhere else to dispose of it.

We have heard, they may have to export it to another location. Will this not cause an increase in the expense, that will probably be filtered down to the residents? In addition this will start the traffic situation all over again.

5. In connection with number four above, we have heard about; "Recycling and Trash into Energy". Can a program be in place in the next sixteen years to either recycle and/or turn all the trash into energy? What plans are there to show this can be accomplished or even partially accomplished?

Dear Mr. Cosney:

Thank you for your letter regarding the Lancaster Landfill conditional use permit application that is currently being reviewed by the Regional Planning Commission. I have been advised by the Regional Planning Department that a public hearing was held on Saturday, February 24, 2007 for this project. Presentations were made and testimony was taken, but the hearing was continued to June 6, 2007 to allow time for additional information to be collected.

The landfill operator, Waste Management of California, Inc. is requesting an increase in the allowable daily volume of municipal solid waste intake from 1,700 tons per day to 3,000 tons per day. This request does not include an expansion of the landfill boundary limits of fill, or elevation of the currently adopted landfill; the increased intake would move the closure date of the landfill forward. Approximately 65 percent of the waste currently accepted at the landfill is from sources outside the Antelope Valley. The proposed additional daily intake would increase that percentage.

Policy for decisions-makers with respect to waste disposal and solid waste management projects in Los Angeles County comes from the Los Angeles County Countywide Waste Management Plan and in the Los Angeles County General Plan.

The Los Angeles County Countywide Waste Management Plan assesses the countywide solid waste disposal needs and how and where best to provide for these needs. Ensuring that Los Angeles County has adequate solid waste disposal capacity is a regional concern that requires countywide integrated planning. The Plan is regularly updated to reflect the projected demand for landfill capacity and the county's need to manage its own waste as much as possible by not shipping it out to other county jurisdictions. The Lancaster Landfill is clearly identified in the Plan as providing a part of that responsibility.

The Los Angeles County General Plan policy related to waste disposal considers the regional and local need for the specific waste disposal facility as well as the potential impacts the use will have upon the community. The Plan cautions that "Regional need should not outweigh the impact on the community. Potential hazards should be given greater consideration than the regional need." (Countywide General Plan, Public Facilities Element, Page VI 27-28)

The Regional Planning Commission will consider policies contained in the aforementioned plans along with other evidence provided including your comments. Thank you for being involved and I encourage you to continue participating in the public hearing process. The June 6, 2007 remains open for public comment.



We strongly oppose the increase importation of trash to the Lancaster Landfill, and that the current importation cease to this landfill.


The landfill should be restricted to trash from the Antelope Valley Region. The importation of trash from outside the region shortens the life of the landfill and would require expansion in 2019. Means must be found to dispose of the imported trash in the region it is coming from. We understand that this would be difficult as the import region doesn't want their trash in their back yard. We don't want their trash in our back yard either.

We believe that the increase in truck traffic will lead to the increase in air pollution due to the exhaust, dust and loose trash. Additional traffic would add to the congestion on the Antelope Valley Freeway and increase the traffic hazards on our local roads and intersections.

The current practice is for the trucks to use Ave. G and Ave. H for their access routes to the landfill, there have been a number of "close calls" at the intersection of Ave. G and Sierra Hwy as a number of trucks have been observed making rolling stops at this intersection. The mitigation plan of extending Ave. F across Sierra Hwy and the railroad would shift the truck traffic into our neighborhood; bring the noise of the trucks and the air pollution into our area. Ave. F is our access to the AV Freeway, the trucks would create an additional hazard for our residents, the intersection of 20th St. W. and Ave. F is narrow and the visibility is poor. An at grade rail crossing at Ave. F would create an additional hazard.

We strongly urge a "NO" to the importation of trash to the Antelope Valley.

Regional Planning Commission:

This letter is concerning the Planning Commissions Hearing held in Lancaster on Feb,24, concerning the proposed increase amount of trash to be delivered to the local "Landfill". I attended the hearing, but was unable to stay for the entire meeting. This did not bother me at the time because on the second page of the AGENDA, it was indicated that it would be finished on the 28th of Feb at the Lancaster location. So, I was there, and behold, no Hearing for whatever reason.

If I had spoken, I would have said that I and I think most of the residents of the Antelope Valley are SICK and TIRED of L.A. sending their trash up here, both the refuse and the people type. Both kinds should be taken care of in the same general areas that generated it in the first place. Just because the high desert used to be a relatively clear and open space is no reason to trash it up the way you are doing. Last year I was in contact with Mr. Antonovichs local office several times complaining about the amount of out of locality trash being delivered here. During the summer, in my opinion, between 50 and 100 tractor-trailer loads were being delivered every day to the local "Landfill". About that time, there was several articles in the news paper about increasing the amount of trash brought up from below. Co-incidentally, maybe, not long after I complained about the number of trucks, that number suddenly decreased to what I estimate now is about 25 per day average. So, again, in my opinion only, Waste Management was probably hauling an unauthorized amount here. Not only that, several years ago, while driving to my job at Edwards AFB before sun-up, for several weeks I met a number of out of valley trucks belonging to Waste management with the words "El Cajon" on large letters clearly painted on them. Now, I only know of one place in California named El Cajon. It couldn't be could it that Waste Management was violating their permitted tonnage, could it???

One last thing , I wish you would not call the disposal site a Landfill. This indicates a gulley or canyon. This one should be referred to as a " Mountain Build", as that is what it has become and will get worse. All government agencies are free with their use of "Eminent Domain" when they want private property for the public use. I wish you would use that power to find a canyon down below, must be plenty of them, to use as a site for trash.

I also think that the commission came up here with their minds made up and this was a square filling legality.

We strongly oppose the increase importation of trash to the Lancaster Landfill, and that the current importation cease to this landfill.


The landfill should be restricted to trash from the Antelope Valley Region. The importation of trash from outside the region shortens the life of the landfill and would require expansion in 2019. Means must be found to dispose of the imported trash in the region it is coming from. We understand that this would be difficult as the import region doesn't want their trash in their back yard. We don't want their trash in our back yard either.

We believe that the increase in truck traffic will lead to the increase in air pollution due to the exhaust, dust and loose trash. Additional traffic would add to the congestion on the Antelope Valley Freeway and increase the traffic hazards on our local roads and intersections.

The current practice is for the trucks to use Ave. G and Ave. H for their access routes to the landfill, there have been a number of "close calls" at the intersection of Ave. G and Sierra Hwy as a number of trucks have been observed making rolling stops at this intersection. The mitigation plan of extending Ave. F across Sierra Hwy and the railroad would shift the truck traffic into our neighborhood; bring the noise of the trucks and the air pollution into our area. Ave. F is our access to the AV Freeway, the trucks would create an additional hazard for our residents, the intersection of 20th St. W. and Ave. F is narrow and the visibility is poor. An at grade rail crossing at Ave. F would create an additional hazard.

We strongly urge a "NO" to the importation of trash to the Antelope Valley.

The Antelope Acres Town Council has reviewed the Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for SCH No. 1993101036 cup no.03-170 and offers the following response. In short, we are opposed to the idea of increasing input to the dump from the current rate of 1,700 tons per day (TPD) to the proposed 3,000 TPD and green waste from the current 1,600 TPD to the proposed 2,800 TPD due to the negative impacts to our area that include:

- * An increase in the number of trucks projected to be some 53 additional trucks per day traveling to and from the landfill between the hours of 5:00 AM to 8:00 PM adding additional congestion on our already crowded roadways as well as increased airborne pollutants and wear and tear.

- * Projected closure of the landfill moving up from 2031 to 2019.

We may have additional objections and concerns depending on answers to the following related questions:

- * The landfill currently accepts waste from Kern County (E.g., EAFB). Will that practice continue?

- * Will our area's residents see increased trash fees resulting from competition with other areas for limited landfill capacity?

- * Where will waste generated in the Antelope Valley be handled when this landfill is closed? I.e., what is the long-range plan for the area and how is that plan impacted by the proposed change?

- * The proposal is currently limited in scope to commercial trash.

Will there be binding limitations prohibiting future expansion to include residential trash?

We are concerned that our area's well being is at risk of being sacrificed on behalf of the needs of other areas and believe it to be in our best interest to oppose the proposal. A representative from Waste Management was recently asked at our Council's January 2007 community meeting to explain any benefits such an expansion would provide the residents of the Antelope Valley. She was unable to offer any benefits for us resulting from such a plan except for the knowledge that we were contributing to meeting the needs of other cities. She explained that Waste Management sees trash as a 'global issue.' Our Council sees the matter as all trash should be local.

At our recent Association of Rural Town Councils meeting I became aware of Waste Management's pursuit of a CUP to increase the amount of tonnage of waste to be deposited in its Lancaster land fill. After hearing the issues I have concluded that this would not be in the best interest of the Antelope Valley.

1. because of the current and anticipated population growth of the A.V. we need every available cubic yard of space in which to deposit our own waste
2. the plan to haul waste from "down below" will add truck trips and truck exhaust pollution to what is already an exasperating amount of traffic on Hwy 14
3. Waste Management says that because this increased tonnage in the Lancaster landfill will make it more profitable for them their customers in the A.V. will actually benefit because costs to their A.V. customers may actually come down. I don't believe this for a moment. When's the last time you saw a decrease in costs for a service like this. Any extra profits will go right into the pockets of the company. In February, '05, the cost of emptying my small 1/3 size dumpster was \$67.27. In March, '05, it jumped to \$92.60 and in March, '06, it jumped to \$102. I obviously complained, but because they are a monopoly they just said too bad.

The companies that work to "serve" the citizens of the county by providing the various necessary services must earn a reasonable profit. However, the County Government exists not only to serve its citizens but to protect its citizens from being fleeced by these same companies. Therefore, I ask Regional Planning to deny this CUP.



Leisure Lake is a senior citizen community of 211 homes located at 20th St. W and Ave. E.

We strongly oppose the increase importation of trash to the Lancaster Landfill, and that the current importation cease to this landfill.

The landfill should be restricted to trash from the Antelope Valley Region. The importation of trash from outside the region shortens the life of the landfill and would require expansion in 2019. Means must be found to dispose of the imported trash in the region it is coming from. We understand that this would be difficult as the import region doesn't want their trash in their back yard. We don't want their trash in our back yard either.

We believe that the increase in truck traffic will lead to the increase in air pollution due to the exhaust, dust and loose trash. Additional traffic would add to the congestion on the Antelope Valley Freeway and increase the traffic hazards on our local roads and intersections.

The current practice is for the trucks to use Ave. G and Ave. H for their access routes to the landfill, there have been a number of "close calls" at the intersection of Ave. G and Sierra Hwy as a number of trucks have been observed making rolling stops at this intersection. The mitigation plan of extending Ave. F across Sierra Hwy and the railroad would shift the truck traffic into our neighborhood; bring the noise of the trucks and the air pollution into our area. Thank you very much for attending the January 25, 2007 ARTC meeting concerning the CUP. As you could see, there were many questions concerning the lack of benefit to the Antelope Valley.

The ARTC has thirteen (13) member Town Councils in the unincorporated north Los Angeles County area. That area covers the unincorporated land north from Santa Clarita to the Kern County line and west from the San Bernardino County line to just east of Interstate 5. In my contact with the thirteen (13) councils there was not one voice calling out for the passage of CUP 03-170-(5).

Waste Management (WM) is asking for a 1300 ton (76%) landfill capacity increase without an increase in size. This increase would not benefit anyone but WM. That in and of itself is not necessarily bad if it didn't adversely impact the community.

I asked Mike Williams, the WM representative, how many years the proposed trash increase would decrease the life span of the present landfill permit. As I hope you saw, Mr. Williams was less than candid about the yearly decrease. What he did, and I feel purposely, was avoid the question. The fact is the full capacity would not be reached for 31 plus years at the present 1700 tons a day permit. Mr. Williams said the landfill would last approximately 16 to 18 years at the new daily level. The new daily trash level would significantly (42%-49%) reduce the life of the landfill. WM admitted there are no contingency plans to mitigate the trash at the end of the landfill permit.

The situation smells (Pun Intended) like a "Get Rich Quicker Scheme." You know, make the money quick, close up shop, and get out of Dodge with the cash. WM could on paper increase their profit by as much as 76% and decrease their commitment to the community by 13 to 15 years. WM is not helping this community by reducing the time before we will have to pay additional charges to transport trash out of the valley. WM admitted this community would likely be forced to transport trash (Negative Impact) when the landfill permit is filled.

The fact that the CUP will adversely impact the community was not denied by their representative. What Mr. Williams did say was WM would try to make the daily addition of more trash and trucks (89) a day impact the community as little as possible. The trucks would only travel during the daylight operating hours of the landfill. Guess what? That's the same time the Antelope Valley community uses the roads. Let's see, 89 trucks divided by operating hours (Approximately 10) equals an additional 8.9 trucks per hour on the freeway. WM knows very well there will be a great deal of adverse impact on the community.

In closing the ARTC and it's thirteen (13) member councils is asking the Planning Commission to reject the CUP. The project will have both lifestyle and financial impact on the community.




