Bio-constraints legend

The project site is under the “N” of “Chino Hills.”

- Extensive areas of Southern Coast Live-oak Woodland occur throughout the parcel.
- Riparian Coast Live-oak Woodland and Southern willow scrub occur in Tonner Creek and tributaries. The road going through the parcel generally follows Tonner Creek
- Magenta areas are Walnut woodland. Walnut woodland on the knoll just east of the project site is unmarked on the map.
- Deeper green has reported *Dudleya multicaulis*, *Lepidium virginicum* var. *robinsonii*, *Calochortus weedii* var. *intermedius*.

Biological constraint notes:

- Access is extremely limited on the parcel, and it may be infrequently visited by persons reporting to CNDDDB.
- The habitat of a mosaic of grasslands (maintained by extensive sheep grazing), riparian areas, woodlands, and sparsely distributed development for Boy Scouts of America activities, has abundant rodents, birds of prey, and large carnivores including occasional use by mountain lions.
- The Tonner Canyon natural area is an extremely important constituent of the Puente Hills-Chino Hills habitat connection and wildlife corridor.
