The Los Angeles County Department of Regional Planning is searching for qualified individuals to serve on the Significant Ecological Areas Technical Advisory Committee (SEATAC) and the Environmental Review Board (ERB).

ROLES OF SEATAC

To advise County staff and decision makers on the consistency of proposed development with the County General Plan, through review of technical biological documents and determination of proposed project compatibility with the biological values of the Significant Ecological Areas within which proposed projects are located.

ROLES OF ERB

To advise County staff and decision makers on the consistency of proposed development with the Santa Monica Mountains Local Coastal Program (LCP), through review of project plans.



CRITERIA FOR SEATAC and ERB MEMBERSHIP

A deep familiarity of the natural history of Los Angeles County combined with experience acquired in the field of environmental analysis, especially experience in biological aspects of and interrelationships between flora and fauna.

Professional work, publication or studies noted and recognized by a professional society or environmental preservation group.

Specific experience and involvement with design practices related to biotic habitat protection in a variety of locations.

A general knowledge of County planning and functions embracing an understanding of the County's planning role as well as constraints.

Past and present involvement in community affairs stemming from personal interest, or a job-related duty, function, or program.
