REGIONAL PLANNING ADDITIONAL COMMENTS AND HOLDS

Case Status/Recommendation: At this time, Regional Planning does not recommend approval of the tentative tract map. Please read below for further details.

1. An Exhibit A map is required for the CUP.
2. The Countywide General Plan update was recently approved. A plan amendment must utilize the newly adopted land use categories. To accommodate the proposed 21 units, you may request an H30 (Residential – 0-30 du/net ac) land use designation. List the proposed land use category on your tentative map.
3. The bbq/patio area adjacent to the guest parking interferes with the required 26 foot back out space for the garage in unit 21. Please redesign.
4. A common walkway a minimum of five feet in width is required for direct access into and through the project site from any sidewalks along the project frontage. The current walkway is not continuous due to the proposed trash enclosures, and parts of the walkway are undersized. Please redesign to meet the walkway requirements.
5. Six guest parking spaces are required (1 space for every 4 units). Only five parking spaces are provided. One guest parking space must be handicap accessible.
6. Elevations and floor plans are needed for building type “B” (duplex). Provide elevations on a separate sheet and not on the exhibit map.
7. Provide colored renderings of the proposed development, primarily the front view of the property.
8. Provide scaled cross-sections of all existing and proposed fences and walls.
9. Side and rear yard fences must not exceed 6 feet. If fence over 6 feet are proposed a yard modification is required.
10. Per 22.52.1225, provide three long-term and eleven short-term bicycle parking spaces.
11. Uncovered porches, platforms, landings, and decks, exceeding an average height of one foot may only project five feet into the required front and rear side yard. Provide elevations showing the patios, landings and stairs.
12. The proposed BBQ must be setback five feet from the rear and side yard.
13. In your CUP Buren of Proof, under A., answer the questions as it relates to the proposed project, not simply the walls.
14. A General Plan Amendment Burden of Proof must be filled out and submitted.
15. Please note that the onsite tree planting requirements for this project is one tree for each 25 feet of street frontage. With a street frontage of 208 feet, 9 trees are required and will be a condition of the final map.

- A completed and signed Land Division application,
- A signed and dated cover letter describing all changes made to the map,
- Six (6) folded and collated copies of Tract/Parcel Map and Exhibit Map/Exhibit “A,”

- Revision fee payment (for the 3rd revision and thereafter), and
- Other materials requested by the case planner.

NOTE: An appointment is required for resubmittal. **You must call the Land Divisions Section at 213-974-6433 to schedule the appointment.** Prior to scheduling, you are encouraged to contact the case planner for a preview of your next SCM submittal.

It is recommended that this tentative map not be approved at this time. This recommendation is based upon information or lack of information that is available concerning the subject property. The removal of this recommendation is contingent upon the submission and satisfactory review of the following:

- (1) An approved hydrology report. Please see attached Hydrology review sheet (Comments 1 and 2) for comments and requirements. The hydrology report shall be submitted directly to Public Works.
- (2) An approved sewer area study. Please see attached Sewer review sheet (Comment 1) for comments and requirements.
- (3) Obtain approval from the Los Angeles County Sanitation District for the discharge of sewer into the sewers trunk line. Please see attached Sewer review sheet (Comment 2) for comments and requirements.
- (4) A revised tentative map and a revised exhibit map are required to show the following additional items:
 - a. Revise the title description on the tentative and exhibit maps to show the following:

FOR CONDOMINIUM PURPOSES
LOCATED IN THE UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY OF

- b. Clearly delineate the limits of the proposed open space areas shown on the tentative map. Please note that open space areas are usually free of any residential construction. The exhibit map is showing proposed residential improvements over the proposed open space areas. All residential construction rights are restricted over any open space areas.

Approval and clearance of the tentative map is subjected to compliance with the following **drainage** comments:

1. Prior to tentative map approval for drainage, submit a hydrology report showing the extent of drainage impacts and provide mitigation acceptable to the County. The analysis should address increases in runoff, any change in drainage patterns, debris producing areas, and the capacity of existing storm drain facilities. Provide line identification of all proposed drainage facilities. Preliminary soils and geology reports related to debris, retention, and detention basins may be required based on geographic and adverse geotechnical conditions. Provide engineering calculations to support sizing of debris, retention, and detention basins. Provide approximate flood hazard and bank erosion setbacks and lot identifications (as needed). Show slopes for existing and proposed streets. Provide a drainage/grading covenant for any offsite work.
2. A water quality section of the Hydrology Report is required to comply with the LID requirements of Los Angeles County Code Section 12.84 (<https://library.municode.com/index.aspx?clientId=16274>).

The following reports consisting of ___ pages are the recommendations of Public Works.

The subdivision shall conform to the design standards and policies of Public Works, in particular, but not limited to the following items:

1. Details and notes shown on the tentative map are not necessarily approved. Any details or notes which may be inconsistent with requirements of ordinances, general conditions of approval, or Department policies must be specifically approved in other conditions, or ordinance requirements are modified to those shown on the tentative map upon approval by the Advisory agency.
2. Easements are tentatively required, subject to review by the Director of Public Works to determine the final locations and requirements.
3. Easements shall not be granted or recorded within areas proposed to be granted, dedicated, or offered for dedication for public streets, highways, access rights, building restriction rights, or other easements until after the final map is filed with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office. If easements are granted after the date of tentative approval, a subordination must be executed by the easement holder prior to the filing of the final map.
4. In lieu of establishing the final specific locations of structures on each lot at this time, the owner, at the time of issuance of a grading or building permit, agrees to develop the property in conformance with the County Code and other appropriate ordinances such as the Building Code, Plumbing Code, Grading Ordinance, Highway Permit Ordinance, Mechanical Code, Zoning Ordinance, Undergrounding of Utilities Ordinance, Water Ordinance, Sanitary Sewer and Industrial Waste Ordinance, Electrical Code, and Fire Code. Improvements and other requirements may be imposed pursuant to such codes and ordinances.
5. All easements existing at the time of final map approval must be accounted for on the approved tentative map. This includes the location, owner, purpose, and recording reference for all existing easements. If an easement is blanket or indeterminate in nature, a statement to that effect must be shown on the tentative map in lieu of its location. If all easements have not been accounted for, submit a corrected tentative map to the Department of Regional Planning for approval.
6. Adjust, relocate, and/or eliminate lot lines, lots, streets, easements, grading, geotechnical protective devices, and/or physical improvements to comply with ordinances, policies, and standards in effect at the date the County determined the application to be complete all to the satisfaction of Public Works.

7. If applicable, quitclaim or relocate easements running through proposed structures.
8. Prior to final approval of the tract/parcel map submit a notarized affidavit to the Director of Public Works, signed by all owners of record at the time of filing of the map with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office, stating that any proposed condominium building has not been constructed or that all buildings have not been occupied or rented and that said building will not be occupied or rented until after the filing of the map with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office.
9. Place standard condominium conversion notes on the final map to the satisfaction of Public Works.
10. Label driveways and multiple access strips as "Private Driveway and Fire Lane" and delineate on the final map to the satisfaction of Public Works.
11. Reserve reciprocal easements for drainage, ingress/egress, sewer, water, utilities, right to grade, and maintenance purposes, etc., in documents over the common private driveways to the satisfaction of Public Works.
12. Remove existing buildings prior to final map approval. Demolition permits are required from the Building and Safety office.
13. Show open space lots on the final map and dedicate residential construction rights over the open space lots.
14. A final tract map must be processed through the Director of Public Works prior to being filed with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office.
15. Prior to submitting the tract map to the Director of Public Works for examination pursuant to Section 66442 of the Government Code, obtain clearances from all affected Departments and Divisions, including a clearance from the Subdivision Mapping Section of the Land Development Division of Public Works for the following mapping items; mathematical accuracy; survey analysis; and correctness of certificates, signatures, etc.
16. A final guarantee will be required at the time of filing of the final map with the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's Office.

17. Within 30 days of the approval date of this land use entitlement or at the time of first plan check submittal, the applicant shall deposit the sum of \$2,000 (Minor Land Divisions) or \$5,000 (Major Land Divisions) with Public Works to defray the cost of verifying conditions of approval for the purpose of issuing final map clearances. This deposit will cover the actual cost of reviewing conditions of approval for Conditional Use Permits, Tentative Tract and Parcel Maps, Vesting Tentative Tract and Parcel Maps, Oak Tree Permits, Specific Plans, General Plan Amendments, Zone Changes, CEQA Mitigation Monitoring Programs and Regulatory Permits from State and Federal Agencies (Fish and Game, USF&W, Army Corps, RWQCB, etc.) as they relate to the various plan check activities and improvement plan designs. In addition, this deposit will be used to conduct site field reviews and attend meetings requested by the applicant and/or his agents for the purpose of resolving technical issues on condition compliance as they relate to improvement plan design, engineering studies, highway alignment studies and tract/parcel map boundary, title and easement issues. When 80% of the deposit is expended, the applicant will be required to provide additional funds to restore the initial deposit. Remaining balances in the deposit account will be refunded upon final map recordation.



The subdivision shall conform to the design standards and policies of Public Works, in particular, but not limited to the following items:

1. Construct driveway approaches to the site to comply with current Americans with Disabilities Act standards on Broadway to the satisfaction of Public Works. Relocate any affected utilities obstructing the driveway.
2. Close any unused driveway with standard curb, gutter, and sidewalk along the property frontage on Broadway to the satisfaction of Public Works.
3. The typical section provided on the tentative map is not necessarily approved as shown.
4. Plant street trees along the property frontage on Broadway.
5. Underground all existing service lines and distribution lines that are less than 50 KV and new utility lines to the satisfaction of Public Works and Southern California Edison. Please contact Construction Division at (626) 458-3129 for new location of any above ground utility structure in the parkway. This condition includes the wooden pole in the existing pavement at northerly property line.
6. Prior to map final approval, enter into an agreement with the County franchised cable TV operator (if an area is served) to permit the installation of cable in a common utility trench to the satisfaction of Public Works; or provide documentation that steps to provide cable TV to the proposed subdivision have been initiated to the satisfaction of Public Works.

1. A water system maintained by the water purveyor, with appurtenant facilities to serve all lots in the land division, must be provided. The system shall include fire hydrants of the type and location (both on-site and off-site) as determined by the Fire Department. The water mains shall be sized to accommodate the total domestic and fire flows.
2. There shall be filed with Public Works a statement from the water purveyor indicating that the water system will be operated by the purveyor, and that under normal conditions, the system will meet the requirements for the land division, and that water service will be provided to each lot.
3. If required, extend the off-site water mainline to serve this subdivision to the satisfaction of Public Works.
4. If required, provide off-site water improvements to bring water to this land division to the satisfaction of Public Works.
5. Easements shall be granted to the County, appropriate agency or entity for the purpose of ingress, egress, construction and maintenance of all infrastructures constructed for this land division to the satisfaction of Public Works.
6. Submit landscape and irrigation plans for each open space lot in the land division, with landscape area greater than 2,500 square feet, in accordance with the Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance.
7. Depict all line of sight easements on the landscaping and grading plans.
8. If recycle water is available, install a separate water irrigation systems for recycled water use per landscape plans.

THE FIRE DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDS APPROVAL OF THIS PROJECT AS PRESENTLY SUBMITTED WITH THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL – ACCESS

1. Access as noted on the Tentative and the Exhibit Maps shall comply with Title 21 (County of Los Angeles Subdivision Code) and Section 503 of the Title 32 (County of Los Angeles Fire Code), which requires an all-weather access surface to be clear to sky.
2. The on-site driveway required for fire apparatus access shall be indicated on the Final Map as "Private Driveway and Fire lane" with the widths clearly depicted.
3. A reciprocal access agreement is required for the driveway being shared by the future homeowners. Provide written verification to the Fire Department prior to Final Map clearance.
4. A construct bond is required for the proposed fire lane within this development. Provide written verification of the posted construction bond to the Fire Department prior to Final Map clearance.
5. The fire lane shall provide an unobstructed width of 26 feet, clear to the sky. Verification for compliance will be performed during the Fire Department review of the architectural plan prior to building permit issuance or prior to occupancy.
6. The proposed pervious pavers on the fire lane shall be designed and maintained to support the imposed load of a fire apparatus weighing 37.5 tons (75,000 pounds). The pavers must provide and maintain an all-weather diving capability. Documentation verifying the load capacity of the proposed paver shall be submitted during the Fire Department review of the architectural plan prior to building permit issuance.

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7. All proposed buildings shall be places such that a fire lane is provided to within 150 feet of all exterior walls of the first story. This measurement shall be by an approved route around the exterior of the building or facility. Verification for compliance will be performed during the Fire Department review of the architectural plan prior to building permit issuance.
 8. The proposed high density residential buildings shall not exceed 30 feet above the lowest level of the Fire Department vehicular access road. Buildings exceeding this height shall provide a minimum unobstructed fire lane width of 28 feet and a setback between 15 feet and 30 feet from the edge of the fire lane to the building wall. Verification for compliance will be performed during the Fire Department review of the architectural plan prior to building permit issuance.
 9. The driveways required for fire apparatus access shall be posted with signs stating "No Parking-Fire Lane" and/or stripped accordingly in compliance with the County of Los Angeles Fire Code prior to occupancy.
 10. The proposed driveway within this development shall provide approved street names and signs. All proposed buildings shall provide approved address numbers. Compliance required prior to occupancy to the satisfaction of the Department of Public Works and the County of Los Angeles Fire Code

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL - WATER

1. Per the fire flow test performed by San Gabriel Valley Water Company dated 10-08-10, the existing fire hydrants and water system meets the current Fire Department requirements. An updated fire flow test will be required by the Fire Department prior to building permit issuance.
2. Install 1 public fire hydrant as noted on the Tentative Map. The location might change depending on the requirements by the jurisdiction water company.

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3. All fire hydrants shall measure 6"x 4"x 2-1/2" brass or bronze, be located to provide a minimum clearance of 3 feet around the fire hydrant, and conform to current AWWA standard C503 or approved equal.
 4. The required fire flow from the public fire hydrant for this development is **2000** gallons per minute at 20 psi for a duration of 2 hours, over and above maximum daily domestic demand.
 5. Prior to final map clearance, provide written verification that the required fire hydrants have been bonded for in lieu of installation.
 6. Vehicular access must be provided and maintained serviceable throughout construction to all required fire hydrants. All required fire hydrants shall be installed, tested, and accepted prior to construction.
 7. Parking shall be restricted 30 feet adjacent to any required public or private fire hydrant, 15 feet on each side measured from the center of the fire hydrant. Adequate signage and/or stripping shall be required prior to occupancy.
 8. An approved automatic fire sprinkler system is required for proposed building within this development. Submit design plans to the Fire Department Sprinkler Plan Check Unit for review and approval prior to installation.

- 2) the payment of in-lieu fees or,
- 3) the provision of amenities or any combination of the above.

The specific determination of how the park obligation will be satisfied will be based on the conditions of approval by the advisory agency as recommended by the Department of Parks and Recreation.
