- 20.** Ordinance for adoption amending the County Code, Title 22 - Planning and Zoning, to establish the Stonyvale Community Standards District (CSD) for the unincorporated community of Stonyvale (5), in the Angeles National Forest, to modify two development standards in the community's A-1-1 base zoning to facilitate construction of single-family residences and accessory structures in a manner that substantially approximates the character of the community prior to the 2009 Station Fire. (11-3790)

On motion of Supervisor Yaroslavsky, seconded by Supervisor Antonovich, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 2011-0048 entitled, "An ordinance amending Title 22 - Planning and Zoning of the Los Angeles County Code, relating to establishing the Stonyvale Community Standards District to facilitate the construction of single-family residences, accessory structures, fences, and walls in the Stonyvale area affected by the 2009 Station Fire, without endangering the health and safety of residents." 

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-0048

An ordinance amending Title 22 – Planning and Zoning of the Los Angeles County Code, relating to establishing the Stonyvale Community Standards District.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 22.44.110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22.44.110 List of dDistricts.

The following community standards districts are added by reference, together with all maps and provisions pertaining thereto:

SECTION 2. Section 22.144.146 is hereby added to read as follows:

22.44.146 Stonyvale Community Standards District.

A. Intent and Purpose. The Stonyvale Community Standards District (CSD) is established to facilitate the construction of single-family residences, accessory structures, fences, and walls in the Stonyvale area affected by the 2009 Station Fire, without endangering the health and safety of residents. This CSD does not modify or waive any other provisions of the County Code or any local, state, and federal laws or regulations.

B. District Boundary. The boundaries of the CSD boundary are shown on the map following this Section.

C. Community-wide Development Standards.

1. Front yard. The minimum required front yard shall be three feet as measured from the nearest edge of the pavement or the nearest edge of the right-of-way of Stonyvale Road, whichever would provide the greater front yard.

Sections 22.48.060, 22.48.070, and 22.48.080 are not applicable;

2. Fences and walls. The maximum height of any fence or wall, including a retaining wall, in any required yard is eight feet.



**Boundary of Stonyvale

Legend:


 **CSD Boundary**
