Thank you for putting me on the list.

With respect to Little Tujunga, a smaller portion is LA City, a larger portion is in LA County. Little Tujunga is vitally connected to Hansen Dam. Let me attach a map and mark the headwater for the LA River (Oak Spring) which lies in the LA County portion of the Little Tujunga Canyon stream complex. I cobbled one from your SEA map and Google Earth. Not perfect scaling, but close enough.

I know I'm preaching to the choir when note that from an environmental standpoint it makes no sense to truncate SEAs by municipal boundaries. I also understand how things get a lot more difficult because of same. Who from LA City would need to be involved to expand this SEA? I suspect omitting Little Tujunga is unintentional because Oak Spring a vital headwater to the LA River and the overall Tujunga Watershed.

It is in LA City's interest to join with you on expanding this because 1/7th of the City's drinking water comes from this SEA *including Little Tujunga and Oak Spring*. Now is a good time to secure the safety of this water source and protect the water that flows through Little Tujunga.
