

## BOND RELEASE INSPECTION CHECKLIST

## **INFORMATION:**

An online **DRP – Base Application - Subdivisions** must be completed via EPIC-LA (<a href="https://epicla.lacounty.gov">https://epicla.lacounty.gov</a>) Incomplete applications will not be accepted. Please refer to "File An Application" (<a href="planning.lacounty.gov/how-do-i/file-an-application">planning.lacounty.gov/how-do-i/file-an-application</a>).

Applicants are advised to consult with planning staff prior to applying at **213-974-6411** or subdivisions@planning.lacounty.gov.

## To submit an inspection request:

- Complete the checklist below.
- Once submitted, your bond release inspection will be scheduled within 6-8 weeks.
- Once completed, a letter will be sent to Public Works recommending release or hold of the bond(s)
  as applicable. (Please note: Regional Planning cannot recommend a "partial bond release" for
  improvements not fully installed or not installed to standard per the project conditions of approval.)

## Please provide the following:

- A signed and dated cover letter requesting an inspection for bond release with the following:
  - Owner and applicant name, address, e-mail and phone number
  - Tract or parcel map number and phase number (if applicable)
  - Site address and Thomas Guide map page and grid number
  - Bond number(s) and amount(s)
  - The lot numbers to be inspected (ex: "Lots 2 and 3 of Tract 44532")
  - Assessor Parcel Numbers (APNs) of all lots to be inspected
  - Total number of trees and/or private driveways to be inspected
  - The approximate linear distance in feet of private streets, fire lanes, and/or walls to be inspected
- 2. One copy of the original bond(s) issued by Public Works.
- 3. **One copy of the project approval package** (approval letter, findings, conditions, mitigation measures) if approved prior to 2008.
- 4. Color photos of the improvements to be inspected. Please ensure that the location and direction of each photo taken is noted on the tract/parcel map or a photo key map; please do not send a portfolio of 50-100 photos without referencing each photo on a map!
- 5. An improvement location map, which may be a copy of the recorded tract or parcel map, <u>highlighting</u> the areas and improvements requested for inspection. Show all items for inspection.
