#### **MEETING SUMMARY**

During the CAC meeting #2, the project team provided an overview of the Metro Area Plan's outreach approach and the results from Round 1 of outreach workshops, including shared values and challenges. During the meeting CAC members were also introduced to the Metro Area Plan Historic Context Statement aspect of the Plan (overview slides attached). CAC members offered their feedback and observations from the outreach efforts as outlined below:

1. The need to collect demographic data. Members expressed the importance of evaluating who the outreach efforts have reached and collecting demographic data to inform targeted outreach efforts moving forward. The concern is that the results collected from the outreach is not holistic of the community. For example, a member from the East LA community noted many business owners in the community were present at the visioning workshop; therefore, the conversations were focused on the business sector and may not be capturing the collective community vision.



- 2. Desire to broaden engagement. Members expressed the need for in-person outreach and increasing noticing efforts such as hiring vendors, and/or recruiting volunteers to conduct door-to-door knocking to engage with residents. Members also expressed a lack of basic planning and land use regulation knowledge in their communities. Members noted that the visioning workshops had low participation relative to the total population of the MAP area. An added concern was that the MAP would not comprehensively address the needs of all community member. A specific example provided was for the East Los Angeles visioning workshop, many participants were from the business community.
- 3. Challenges during COVID-19 restrictions. CAC members acknowledged the COVID-19 related limitations to in-person outreach and door-to-door knocking. One member noted that people are not receptive to canvassing type of outreach in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Although in-person is ideal, future outreach events need to consider if people will feel comfortable to attend in-person events. An example provided was that previous to the COVID-19 pandemic, in West Athens Westmont, community meetings would draw up to 70 residents.





- Donuts on streets like Lime and Compton is a nuisance





