



INTRODUCTION





North Claremont is 541 acres, located in the northeast part of the East San Gabriel Valley. It contains a residential community to the south and open space to the north, part of the Claremont Wilderness Park. The area shares boundaries with the City of Claremont to the south, east, and west, and the Angeles National Forest to the north.

The residential area is part of a historic arts colony named Padua Hills which operated one of the original theaters performing Mexican musicals and worked to promote intercultural understanding between European and Mexican Americans. It dates back to 1931 and operated until 1974. The theater is in the City of Claremont and on the National Register of Historic Places.

COMMUNITY CHARACTERISTICS



Community Layout

The Padua Hills residential neighborhood is built at the base of the Claremont Wilderness Park with open space located just beyond the residences.



Land Use

North Claremont is primarily public open space, part of the Claremont Wilderness Park. A noncontiguous portion to the south in Padua Hills is entirely residential.



Main Roads

Mount Baldy Rd. is the main access road to the residential subdivision. Via Padua runs north-south through the subdivision and connects to Mount Baldy Rd. The northern open space section contains Palmer Canyon Rd.



Waterways

Waterways flow downhill, southward through the canyons in the unincorporated part of the Claremont Wilderness Park. A waterway also runs through the residential neighborhood, Padua Hills, flowing roughly parallel to Mount Baldy Rd.



Topography

The elevation ranges from 3,200' above sea level down to 2,000'. The land has steep slopes and canyons with varied vegetation.



Significant Ecological Areas (SEA)

The San Dimas Canyon/San Antonio Wash SEA is designated on the northern parcel. The SEA is part of a larger system of designated land with high levels of biodiversity needing additional protections. The SEA continues into the City of Claremont.













North Claremont





North Claremont
