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


Vision Statement

Westside Area Plan Project Overview

General Plan Amendment

- Areawide Goals and Policies: Land Use, Mobility, Conservation and Open Space, Public Services and Facilities, Historic Preservation, and Economic Development.
- Areawide Implementation Programs
- **Community Chapters:** With additional goals, policies, and implementation programs that are community-specific.
- Updates to the land use element to:
 - Incorporate land use policy changes identified in the Housing Element.
 - Maintain consistency between zoning and land use policy.
 - Redesignate certain areas to facilitate additional housing.



Westside Area Plan Project Overview

Zoning Updates

 Changes would include updating the zoning map for the Westside Planning Area to maintain consistency with existing and updated land use map and incorporate proposed rezoning identified in the Housing Element to meet the Regional Housing Needs Assessment goals for Los Angeles County.

Advance Planning Case- Title 22


 Title 22 (Planning and Zoning) of the County code would be updated to establish a Planning Area Standards District to create development standards that are applicable to all unincorporated communities in the Westside Planning Area and would include community-specific standards on an as-needed basis.














California Environmental Quality Act



- 1. Inform decision-makers and public about potentially significant physical effects on the environment.
- 2. Foster interagency coordination.
- 3. Identify ways to avoid or significantly reduce environmental impacts.
- 4. Prevent significant avoidable impacts through feasible alternatives and/or mitigation.



Environmental Impact Report (EIR)

- If agency determines that a project may have a significant effect on the environment, an EIR must be prepared.
- An EIR must identify mitigation and analyze alternatives.
- Prevent significant avoidable impacts through feasible alternatives and/or mitigation.
- If a project is approved with significant impacts, disclose to the public the reasons why.



Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR)

- EIR vs. Program EIR (CEQA Guidelines, Section 15168)
- EIR for a series of related actions
- In connection with issuance of rules, regulations, plans or other general criteria to govern the conduct of a continuing program
- Allows the Lead Agency to consider broad policy alternatives and program-wide mitigation measures
- Can be used to simplify the task of preparing environmental documents on later activities in the program

- 6. Organizations and persons consulted




