Acton Historic Resource Survey (HRS)

What is a Historic Resource Survey?

The Historic Resource Survey is made up of two parts:

- Historic Context Statement
- Windshield Survey and Report

It is intended to document historical activities or events, historic personages, building types, architectural styles and materials, and patterns of physical development.

It is intended to be used by individual property owners and the County in the evaluation of the eligibility of individual property owners for listing in the County Landmark Register, and for assessing the potential for adverse effects of specific projects on the eligibility for listing of buildings and structures on local, state, or federal registers of landmarks, places, or resources.

- References:** If you know where we can find more information on the location, please provide any citations to books, websites, or local historians where we can learn more!
