



TEMPORARY HOUSING



You may use a recreational vehicle, manufactured home, or mobilehome as temporary housing if you lived in a legally-established single-family residence, accessory dwelling unit(s), or caretaker's residence that was destroyed or made uninhabitable by a disaster. The temporary housing unit must not be placed on any existing debris field. For more information, please visit: <https://recovery.lacounty.gov/temporary-housing/>

Step 1: Site Clearance and Application Submission

Site Clearance

- **Phase 1: Household Hazardous Debris Removal** - The U.S. EPA has initiated the removal of hazardous materials. The EPA must provide clearance before moving to Phase 2.
- **Phase 2: Fire Debris Removal** - Property owners can opt in for free cleanup by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers or opt out and pay a specialized, approved contractor to remove the remaining fire debris. *Opt in/Opt out deadline: March 31, 2025*

Application Submission

- Your application will be expedited.
- LA County will accept applications for temporary housing when a property owner is ready to submit them. Applications will be reviewed concurrently with Phases 1 and 2 site clearance activities.

Step 2: Permits

Your application will be internally routed for review with LA County Planning, Public Health, and Building and Safety.

Site Clearance under Step 1 must be completed before the issuance of the Temporary Housing Permit.

Step 3: Set Up Temporary Housing



Inspections may be required.
