Errata:

1. Protection **not** limited to oak trees *native* to Southern California.

Protected oak tree

Any living oak tree (genus *Quercus*) with one trunk measuring eight inches in diameter at four and a half feet above natural grade (DBH), or in the case of an oak tree with more than one trunk, a combination of the two largest trunks measuring a total of twelve inches in diameter or more in at four and a half feet above natural grade (DBH). Protected oak trees include: (1) oak trees with these trunk diameter sizes and larger, as well as (2) replacement, and other oak trees that have been planted as a requirement of a County permit or code, regardless of trunk diameter size.
