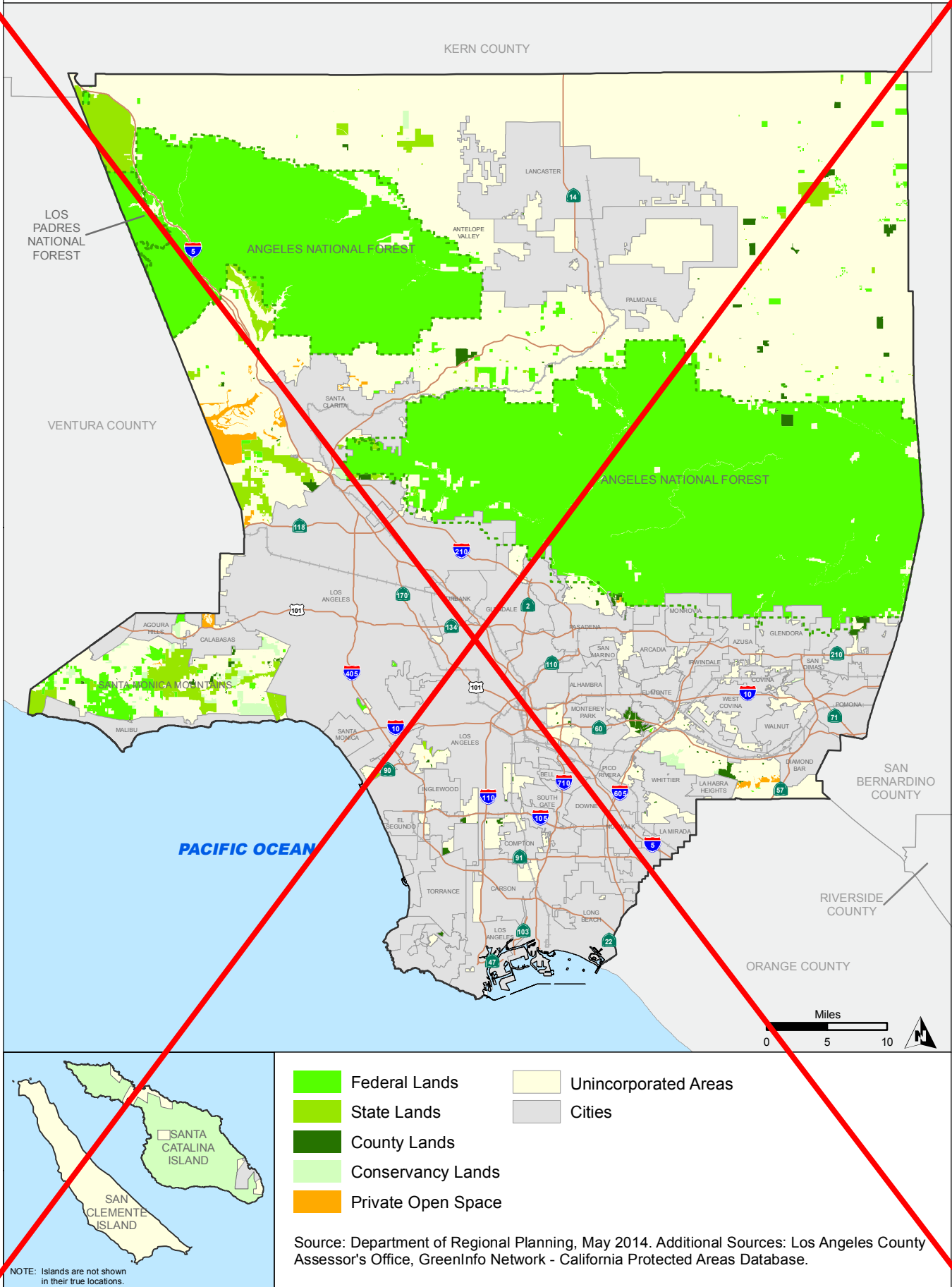
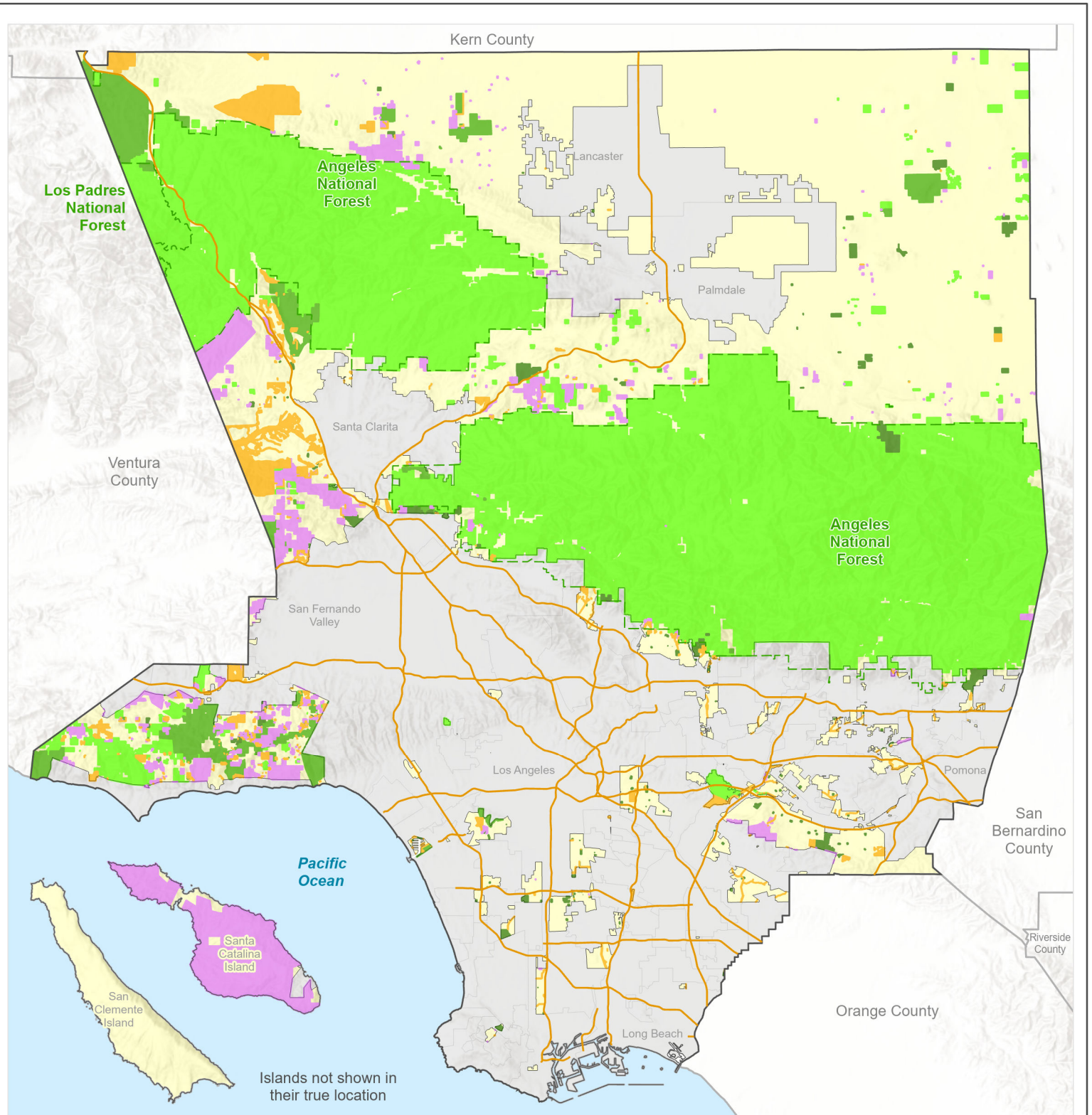


Figure 9.1 - Unincorporated Los Angeles County Open Space Resources Policy Map - DRAFT

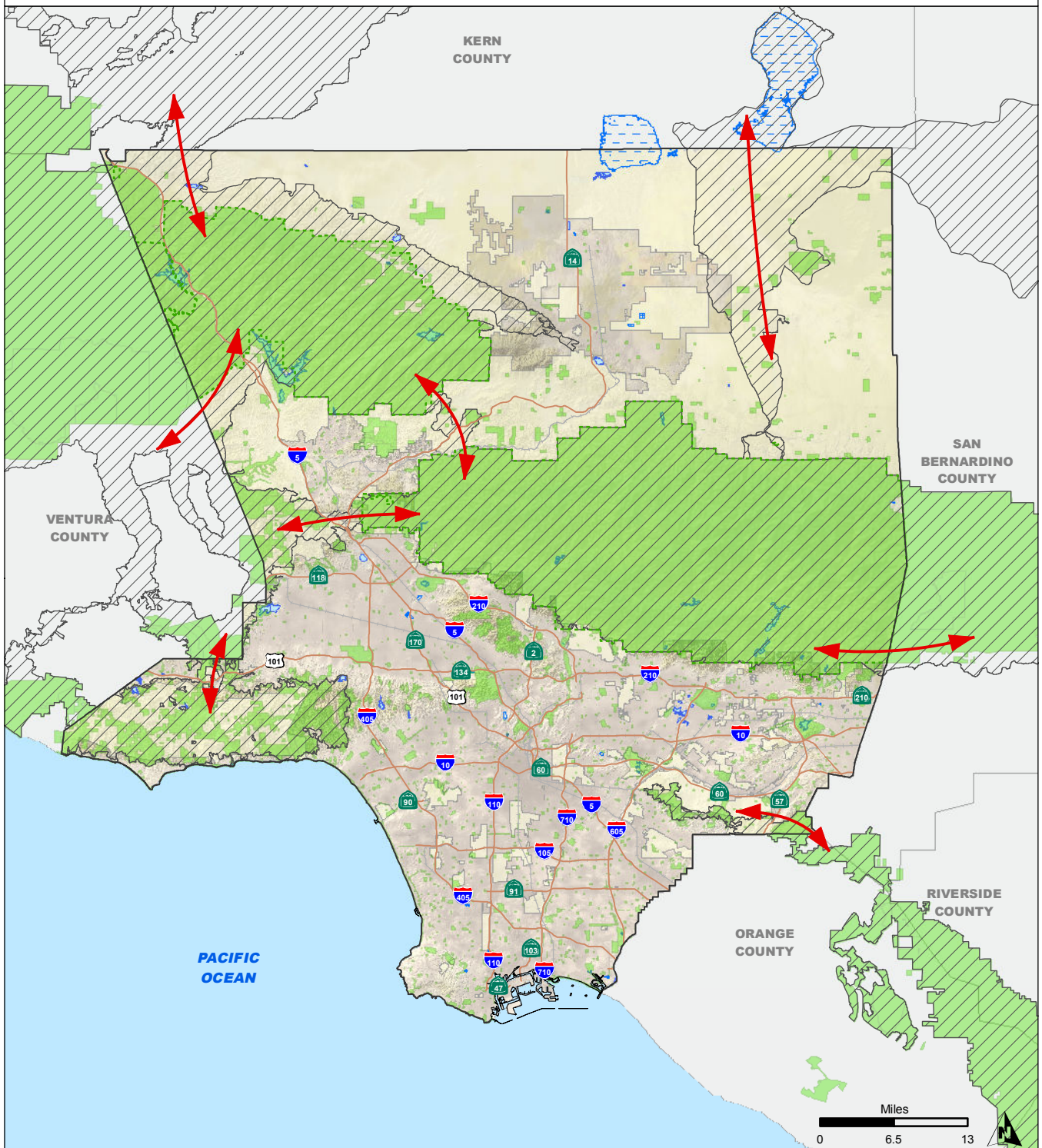

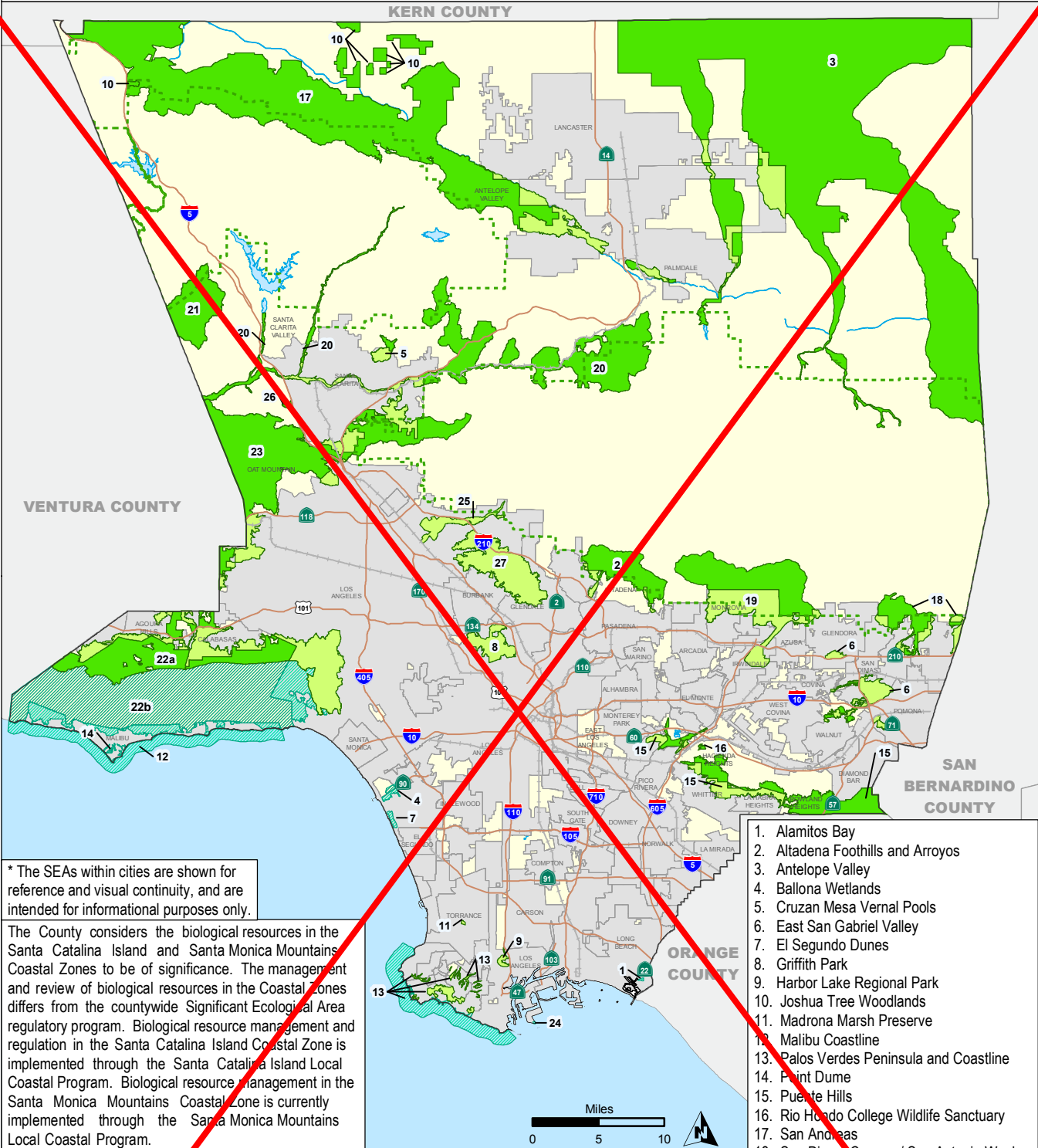

The management and review of biological resources in the Coastal Zones differs from the countywide Significant Ecological Area regulatory program. Biological resource management and regulation in the Santa Catalina Island Coastal Zone is implemented through the Santa Catalina Island Local Coastal Program. Biological resource management in the Santa Monica Mountains Coastal Zone is currently implemented through the Santa Monica Mountains Local Coastal Program.

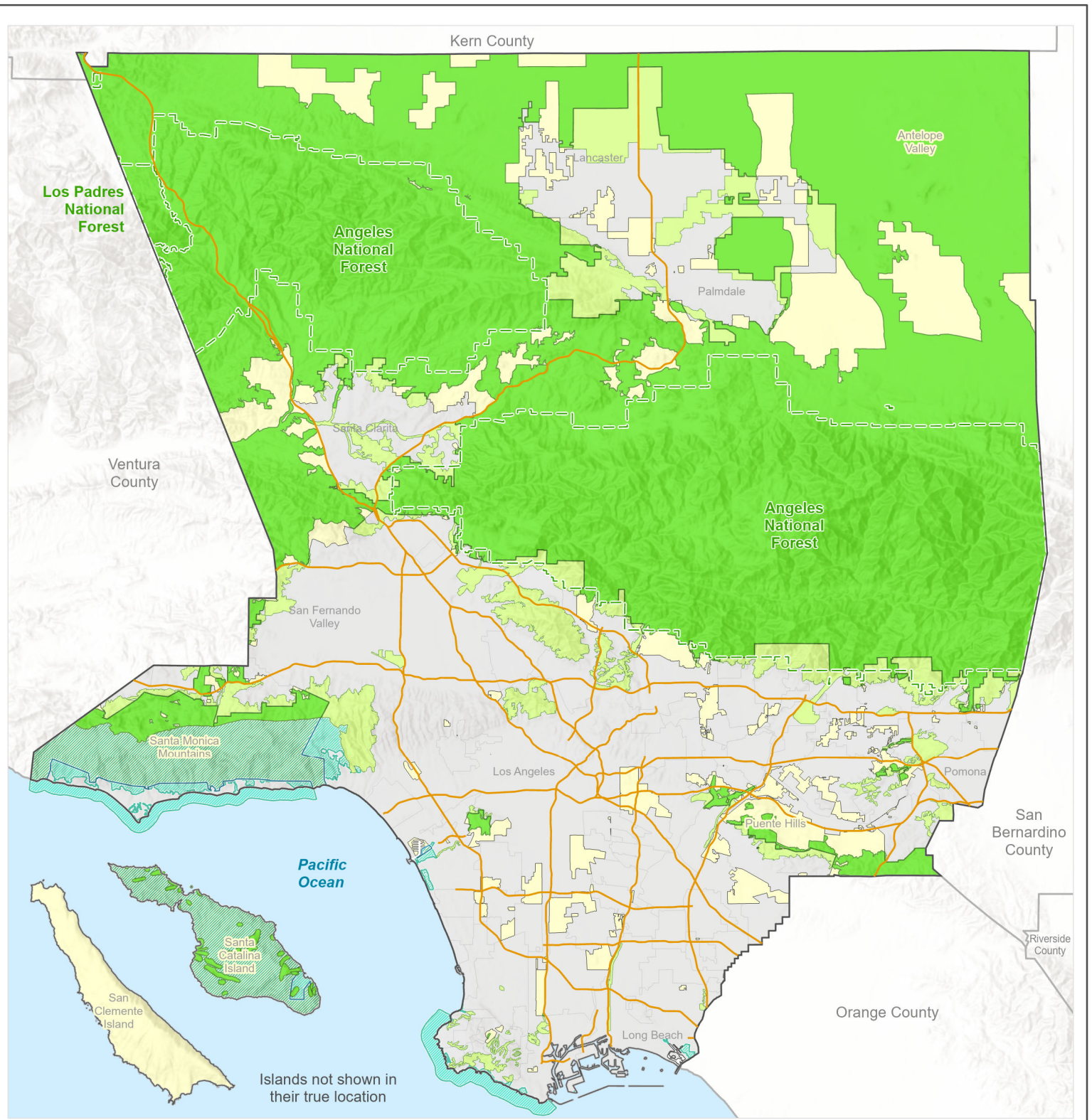

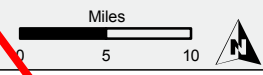

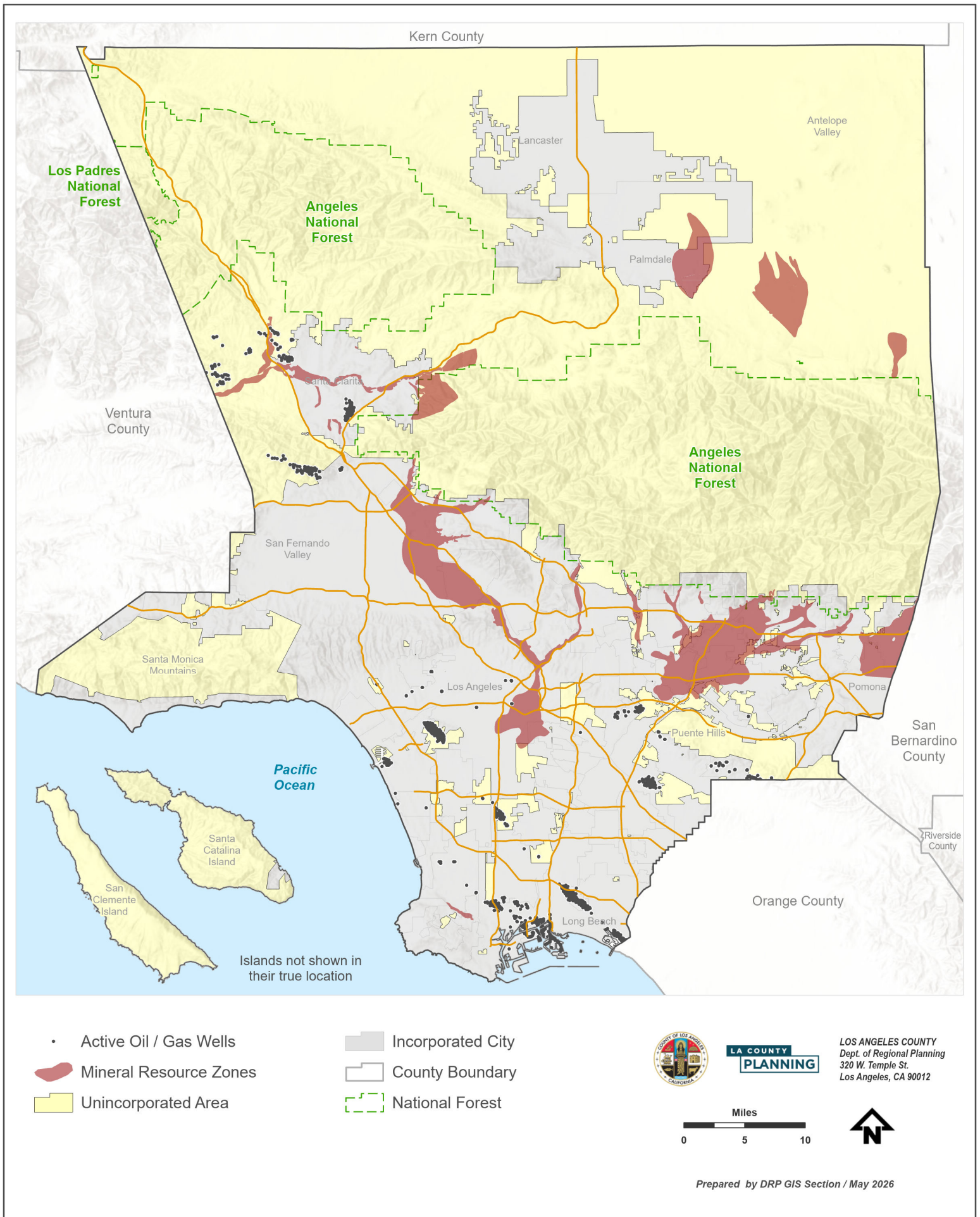

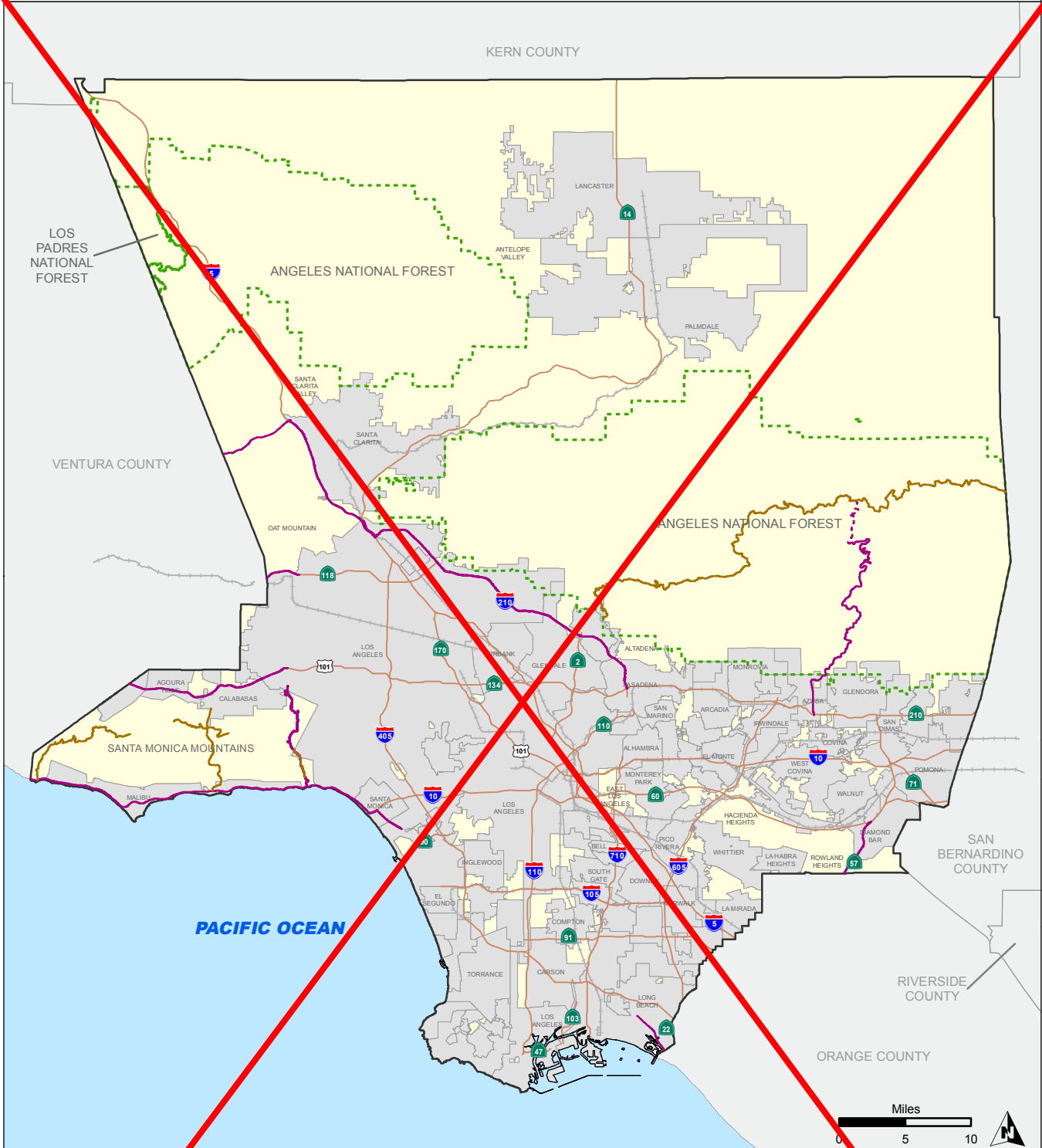

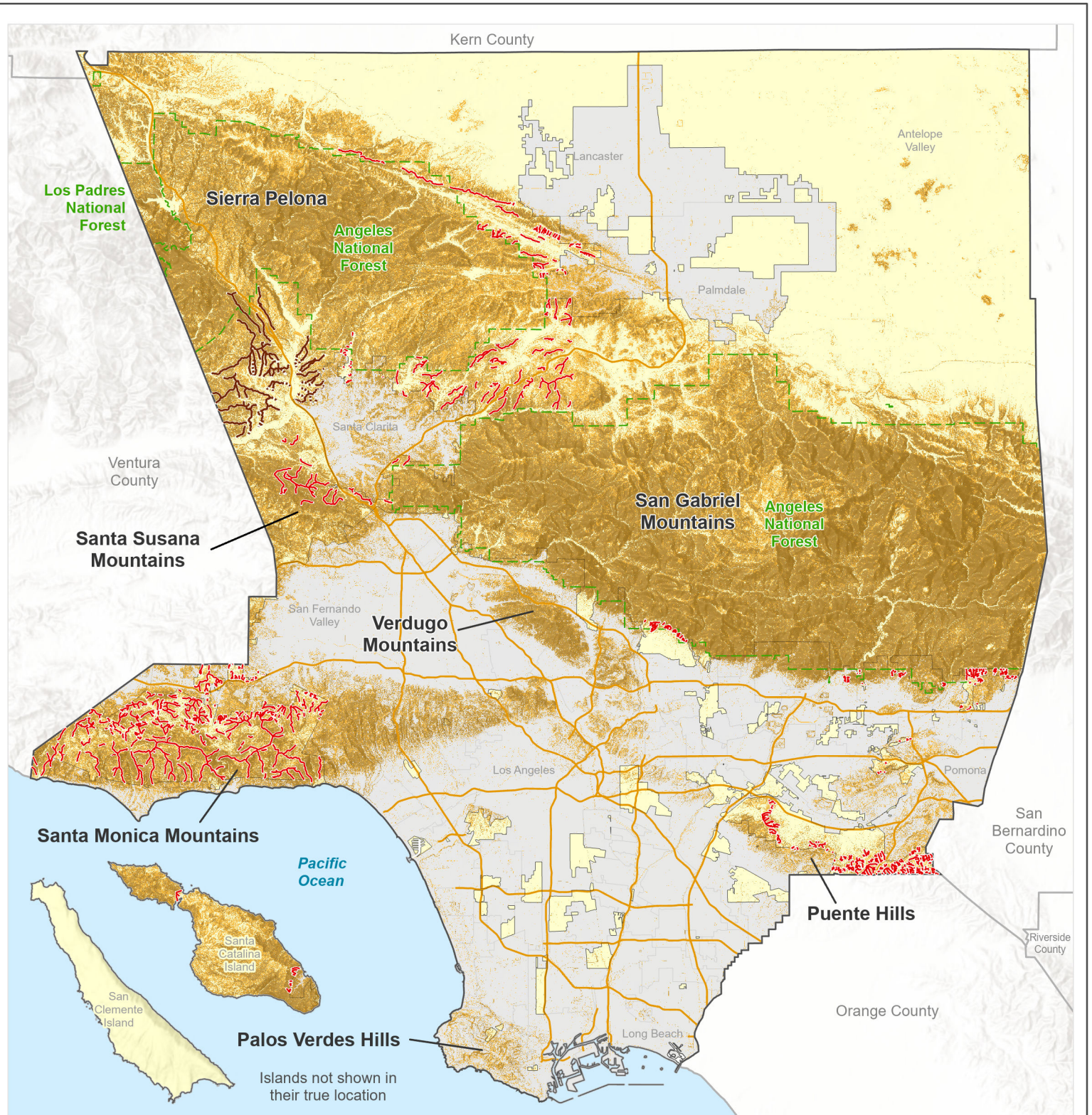

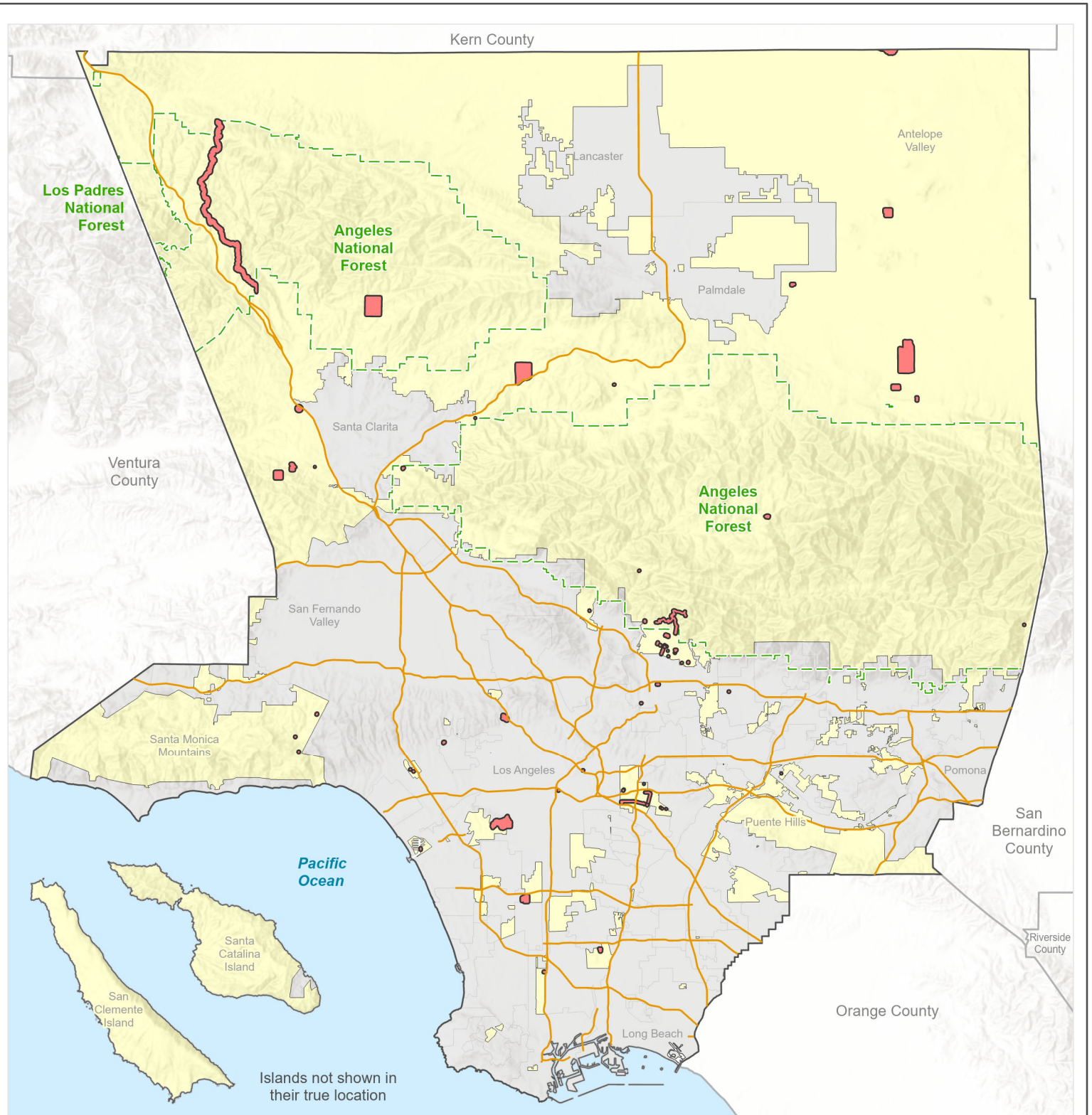

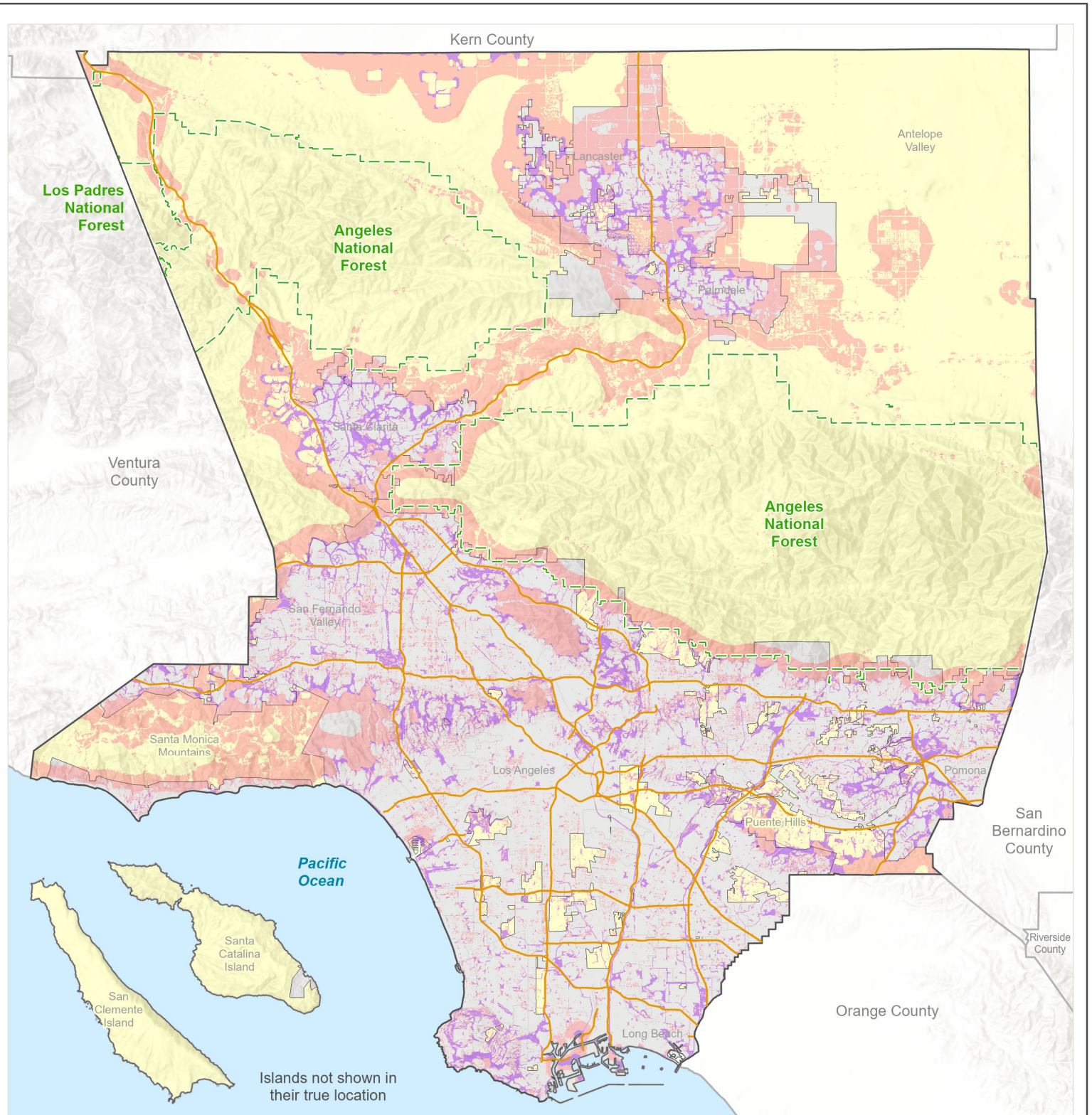
