LAC PW: Supporting Wastewater Management

Unincorporated LA County covers more than **2,600** square miles and is home to approximately **1 million** residents

- **Provide service for over 500,000 parcels and 2 million residents**
- **37 member cities, 3 contract cities**
- LAC PW plays a central role in designing, building, operating, and maintaining the **mainline sewer system** throughout many parts of LA County, both **incorporated and unincorporated**

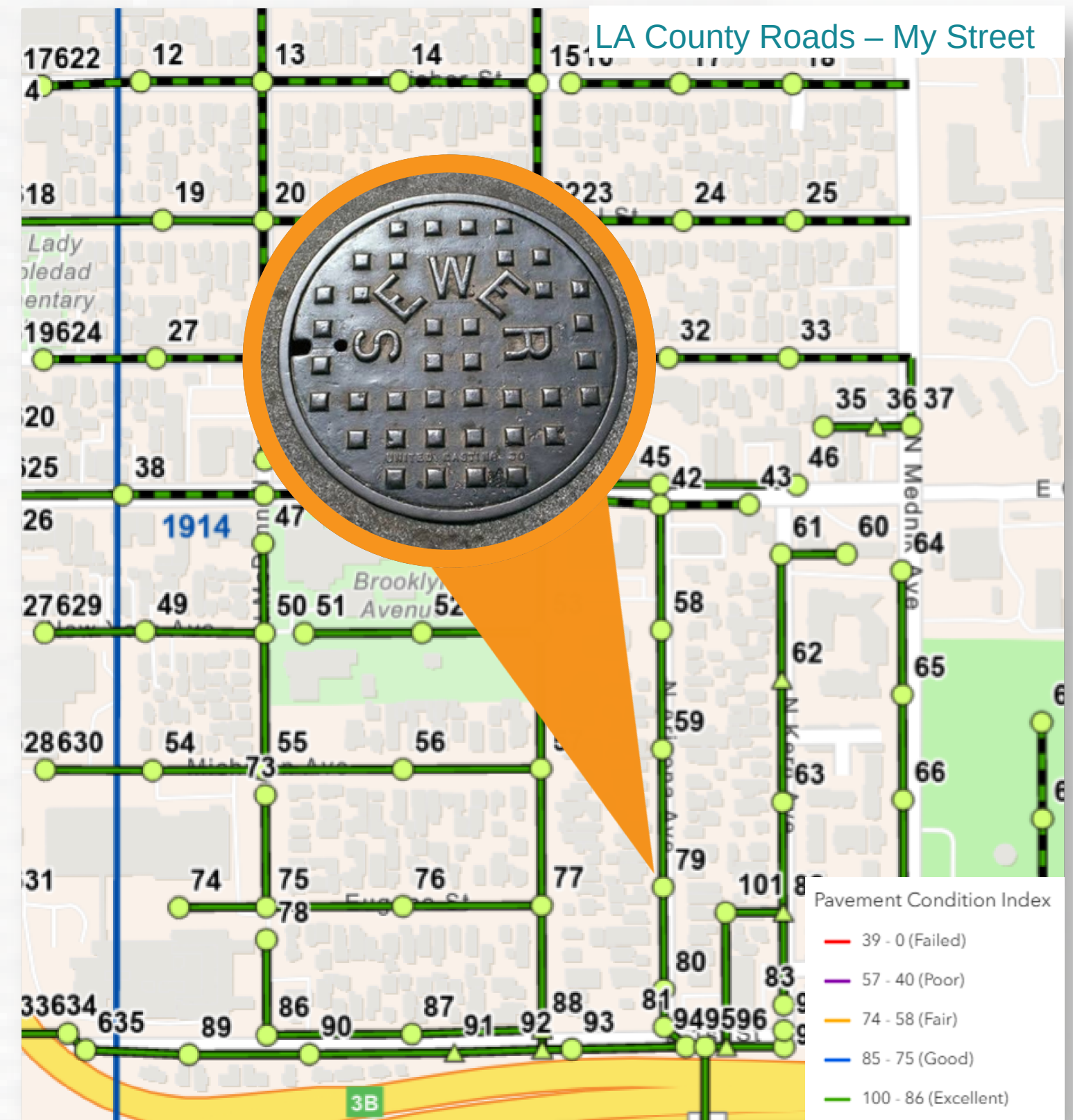


LAC PW: Supporting Wastewater Management

Our Infrastructure Network at a Glance

PW Manages & Maintains:

- **4,600** miles of sanitary sewers in unincorporated areas
- **88** pump stations
- **4** wastewater treatment plants
- **71** pump stations outside of the District System

LAC PW: Supporting Wastewater Management

Shaping how we flush, rinse, and wash

What this means:

LA County Public Works must ensure our sewage infrastructure is in good condition and:

- **Prevents** backups into homes and streets
- **Protects public health** from exposure to untreated sewage
- **Reduces pollution** to rivers, beaches, and groundwater



**Who is responsible for Sewer
Infrastructure in LA County?**

It depends.

LAC PW's General Responsibilities

Shaping how we flush, rinse, and wash

As a department, Public Works is generally responsible for:

- **Cleaning and inspecting** sewer lines regularly
- **Repairing** damaged or blocked pipes
- **Responding** to sewer overflows or emergency backups

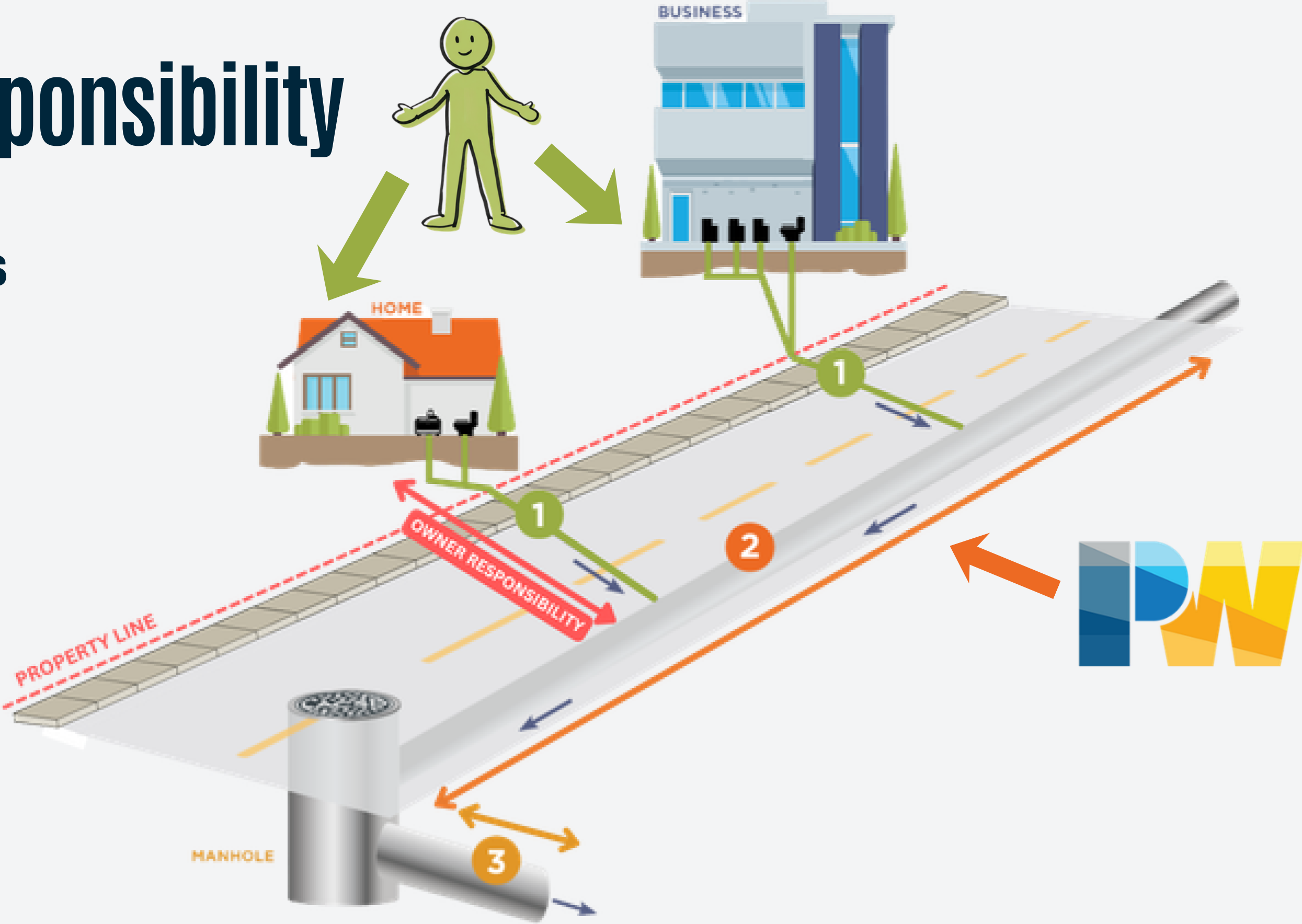

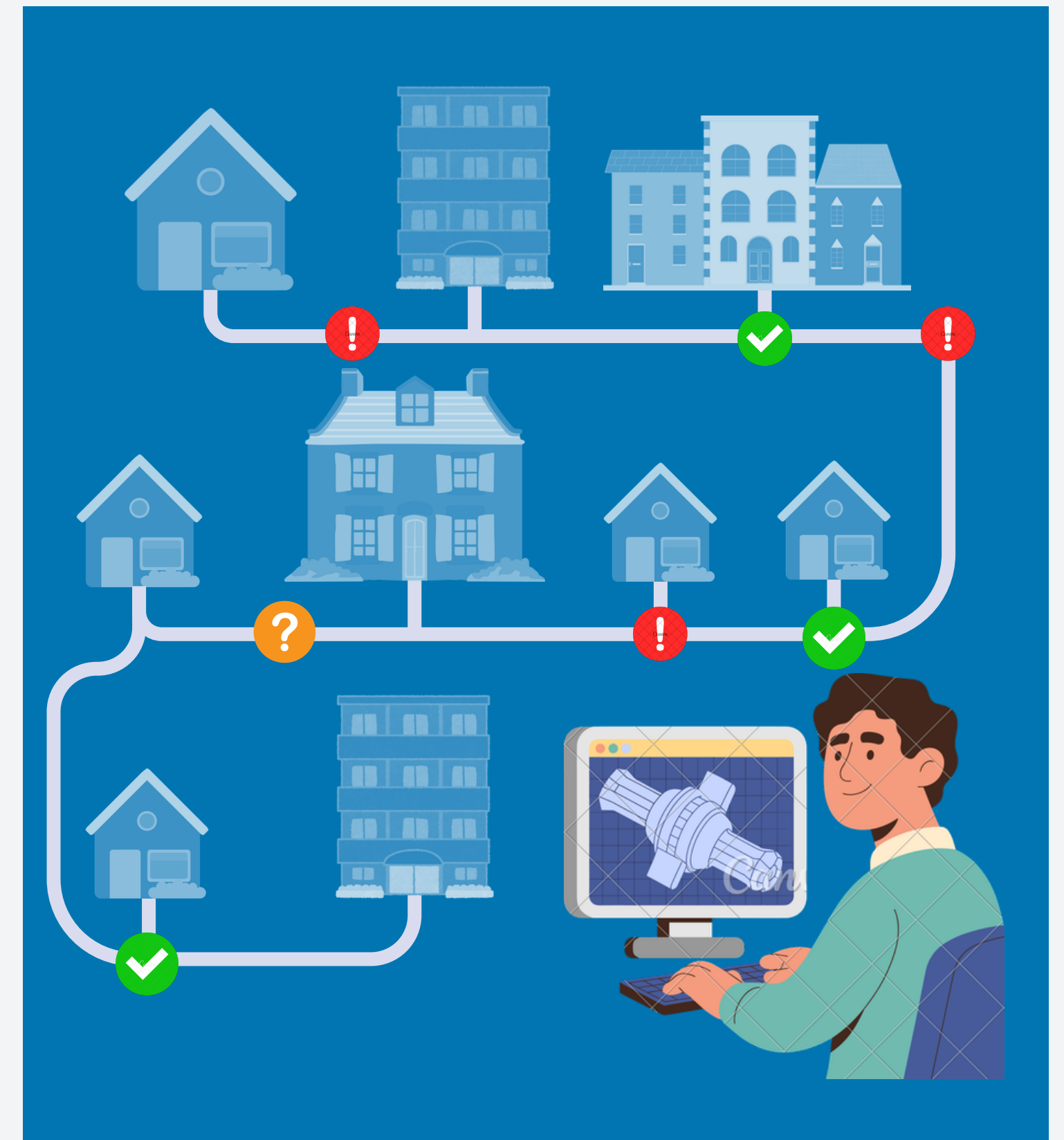


How Do We Preserve & Improve Sewer Infrastructure?

Why Long-Term Infrastructure Plans Matter

Creating a Roadmap for Preservation and Expansion

To meet current and future infrastructure demands as the region grows, the County launched **a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) program** focused on maintaining, improving and expanding essential public infrastructure—including sewers



Introducing Capital Improvement Plans (CIPs)

Creating a Roadmap for Implementation

The Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) will be a long-term strategic plan that guides how the County prioritizes, plans, and funds infrastructure projects over the next 5-10 years.

Implementing Long-Term Plans

Ongoing Infrastructure Projects & Programs

Over a 10 year cycle, the County of Los Angeles **will inspect every foot of the sanitary sewer system using CCTV robot inspections** and identify necessary repair or replace broken or deteriorated sections of the sanitary sewers

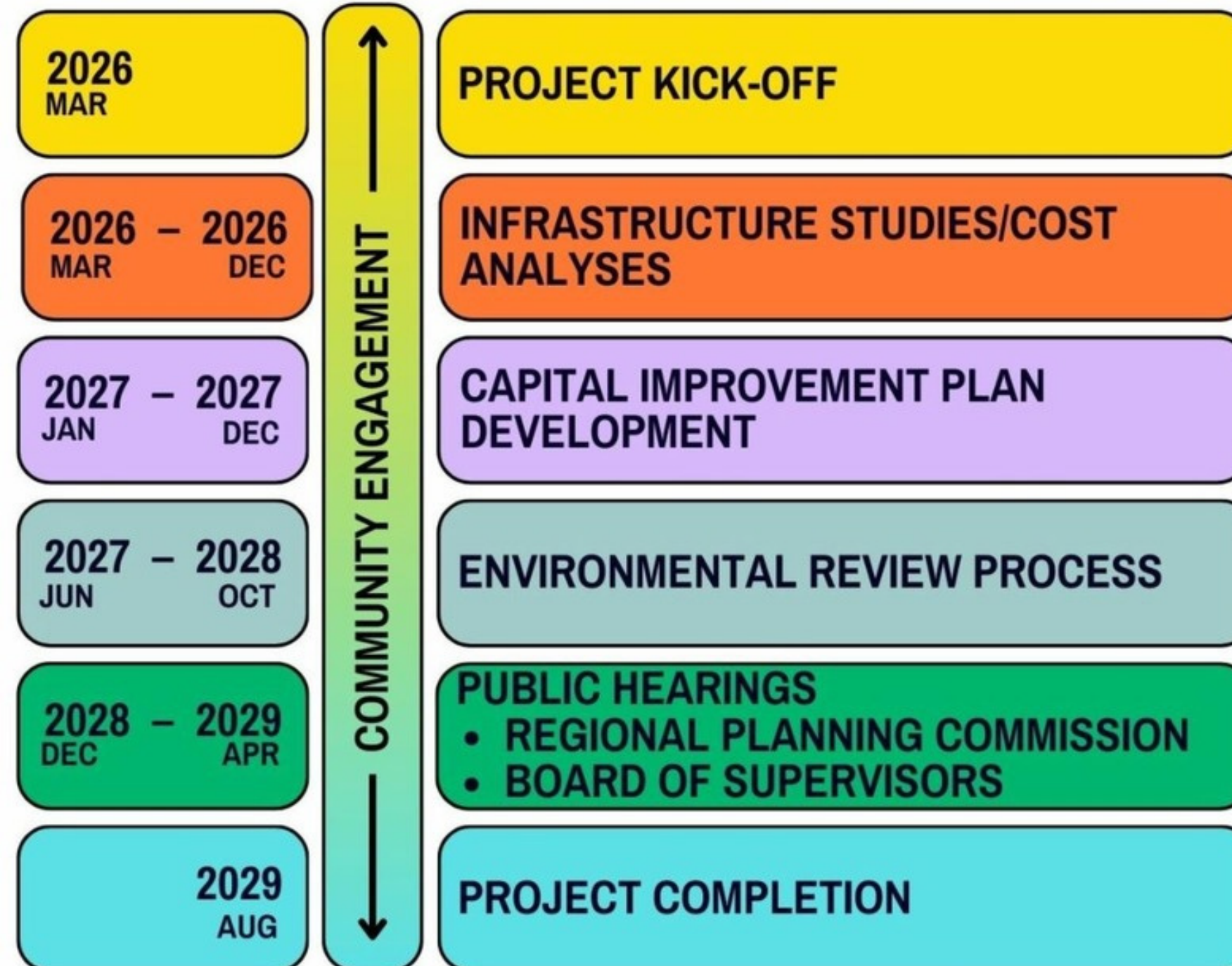

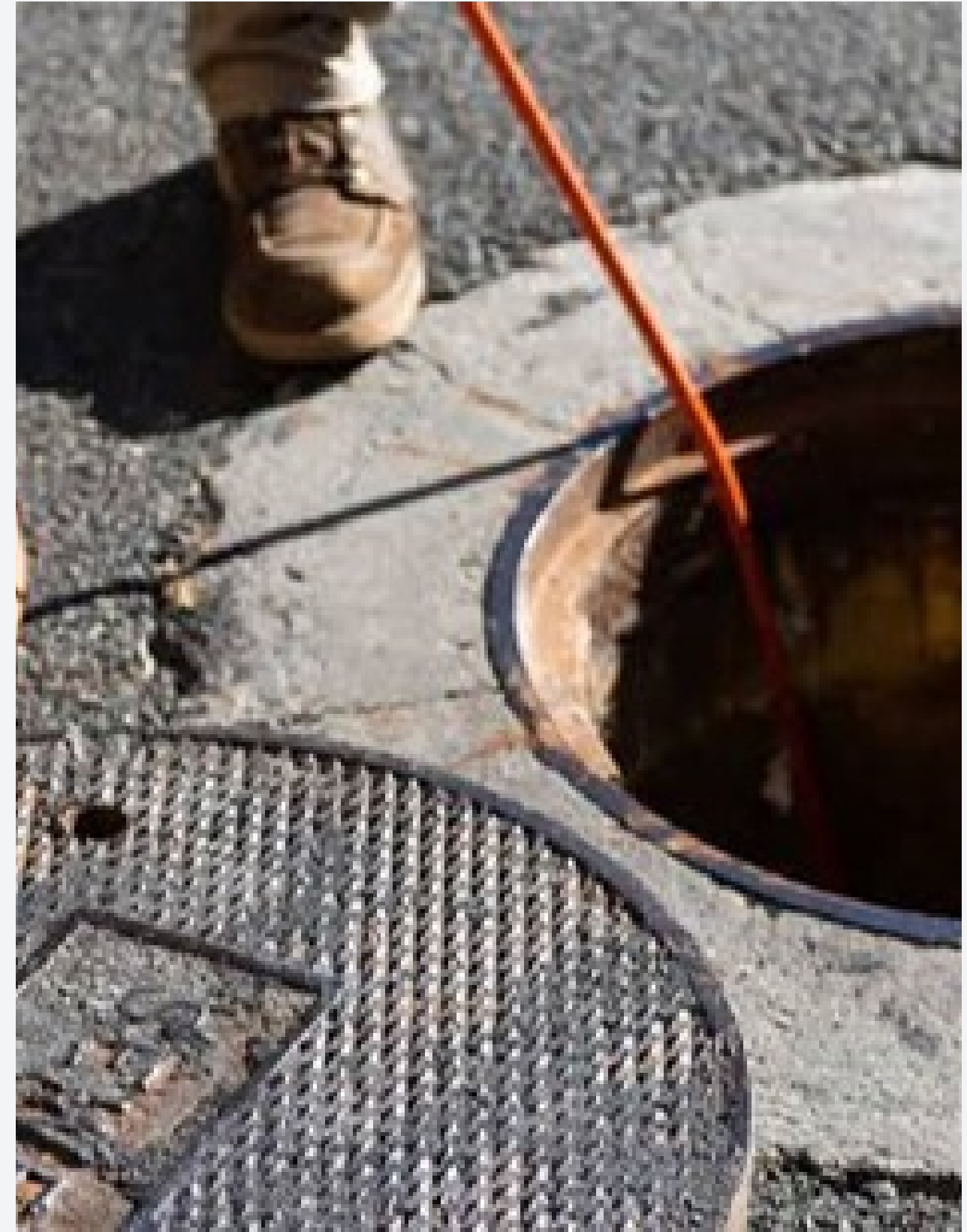

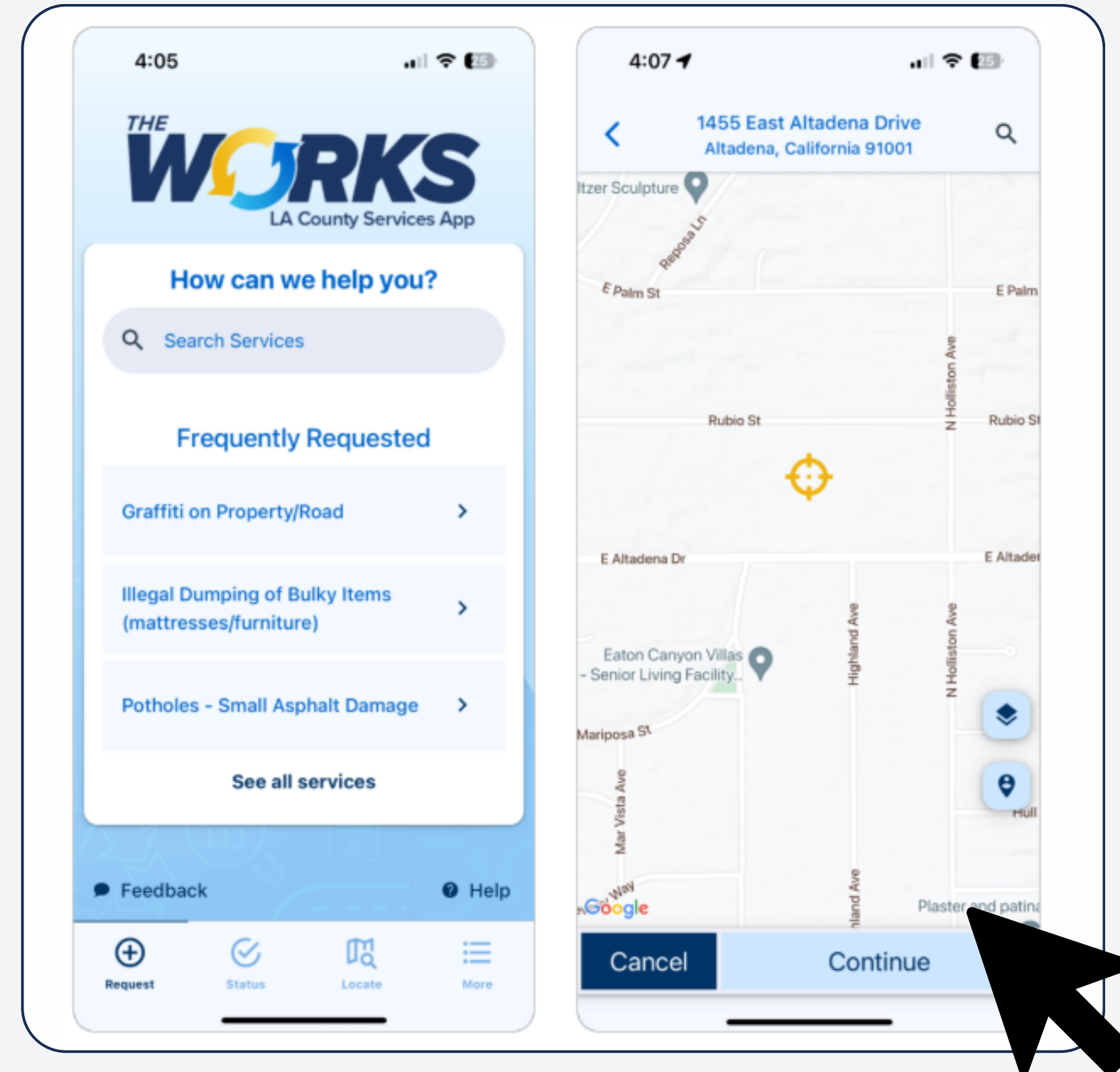
Meanwhile: Support Ongoing Infrastructure Maintenance
